

JURIED ART SHOW

SUMMER on Long Island

Calling all artists with an interest in Long Island!
Here's a chance to have your work displayed in a museum!

Eligibility: Open to all artists, both amateur and professional. **All submissions must represent Summer on Long Island.** Work must be original and not previously exhibited at the Long Island Museum in its juried shows. Long Island Museum employees and their immediate families/household members are not eligible to enter.

Awards: Prizes will be awarded for 1st place, 2nd place, 3rd place and honorable mention.

Limitations: There is no minimum size requirement. The maximum size is 40"x 40". All works must be ready to hang, and all hanging hardware must be provided. Three-dimensional pieces cannot be larger than 40" in any one direction and pedestal must be provided. Completed entry form must be on reverse of all pieces. Up to three entries per person may be submitted.

Submission Guidelines: All entries must be submitted by July 11, 2008. Entrants may submit up to three works in any media through one of the following methods. (e-mail submissions preferred)

By mail: Slides or a CD* must be clearly labeled with the artist's name and title of work. Include no more than one image of each work submitted. CD entries must also adhere to the **digital entry guidelines below***. Mailed entries must be accompanied by a completed entry form and non-refundable entry fee. If you would like your slides, or CD returned you must include a self-addressed stamped envelope.

By e-mail: Send one image for each work submitted to: art@longislandmuseum.org in accordance with the **digital entry guidelines below***. You must then mail a completed entry form with a check or money order to the museum.

*All digital entries must meet the following specifications: File names = artist's last name followed by the entry number as noted on the entry form (i.e. Jones1.jpg, Jones2.jpg, etc.). The image files should be in JPEG format, image resolution should be 72dpi and no larger than 2000 pixels in any direction. Images must be oriented properly (i.e. top of image is top of artwork) and be readable on a Microsoft Windows based PC computer.

Fees: \$25 for Long Island Museum members, \$30 for non-members, for up to three entries. Please make check or money order payable to the Long Island Museum. If you submit your entry via email, you must send a check or money order in the mail. **Your entry will not be valid until payment is received.**

Space: Final selections will be displayed in the Gillespie Room, in the Carriage Museum, from August 16 through September 1, 2008. Winning entries will be displayed in the entrance hall of the Art Museum from September 3 through 21, 2008.

Delivery Instructions for Finalists:

Artwork may be shipped or hand-delivered to the Long Island Museum, 1200 Route 25A, Stony Brook NY 11790. **Hand-delivered entries may be dropped off only on August 12 and 13, 2008, between noon and 7 p.m. in the Gillespie Room of the Carriage Museum. The Long Island Museum of American, Art, History and Carriages is not responsible for lost or damaged artwork.** Shipped entries must be received by August 11, 2008. Please package artwork in reusable containers and enclose:

- (1) Correct return shipping fee via US Mail, UPS, FedEx, etc.
- (2) Completed entry form.

Important Information:

All hand-delivered artwork not selected must be picked up on the following dates and times at the Long Island Museum: Tuesday, September 2, 2008 between noon and 7 p.m.; Wednesday, September 3, 2008 between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Arrangements for pickup of works by the winning artists will be made after September 21, 2008. A storage fee of \$3 per piece per day will be charged for pieces not picked up on the appointed days and artwork will be stored at the Museum at the owner's risk. **Any artwork not picked up after 30 days will become the property of the Long Island Museum.**

Awards Reception:

Finalists will be notified by telephone or e-mail by July 25, 2008. An Awards Reception will be held on Sunday, August 17, 2008, in the Gillespie Room of the Long Island Museum from 2 - 4 p.m. Cash prizes and ribbons will be awarded to the winners. The public is invited to attend to view the winning pieces, as well as meet the artists.
